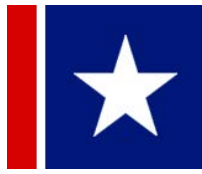

Introduction and Program Background

The Program

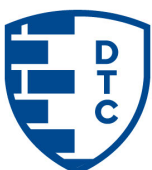
The Bill Blackwood Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas (LEMIT) at Sam Houston State University was awarded a grant from the Department of Justice's Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) in October of 2022 to establish a De-Escalation Training Center (DTC). LEMIT has established credibility and expertise in the field of law enforcement with over 35 years of experience in offering continuing education to law enforcement professionals in Texas. In alignment with the mission of the COPS Office, the DTC's primary objective is to expand de-escalation training opportunities for law enforcement, seeking to educate participants on the importance and implementation of de-escalation tactics. Through their extensive network of law enforcement connections in Texas, LEMIT supports the DTC in serving agencies in Texas, as well as those in Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, and surrounding states.

In February 2023, Garreth Tiefenbach was hired as Director of the DTC. In April 2023, Nyssa Varner was hired as the Administrative Associate. In the early months of 2023, the center staff developed critical infrastructure, established a training calendar, marketed and promoted upcoming trainings, and made connections with several vital stakeholders including police departments, the Texas Police Chiefs Association, various departments at SHSU, training providers, COPS Office personnel, and the COPS National De-Escalation Training Coordinator at St. Petersburg (FL) College. The first training was held at LEMIT on April 24-25 and in total 18 trainings were held in the calendar year of 2023.

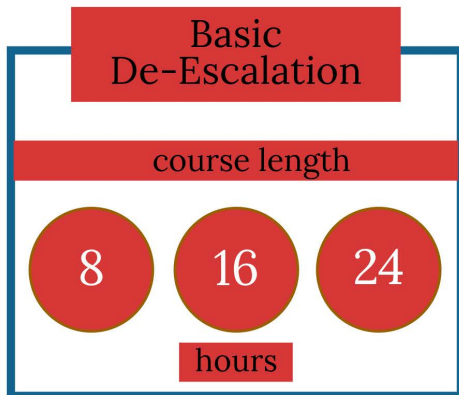

Training Overview

Below is a breakdown of the trainings that we offer, and valuable insight about the program.



Basic De-Escalation courses provide participants with practical de-escalation skills that they can apply to their daily work operations. Trainings range in focus from the psychological aspects of de-escalation, use of force, duty to intervene, practical de-escalation tactics, and additional topics.

Train the Trainer courses offer participants all the same value and education found in the basic course while also certifying officers to teach the course at their own agency. These classes include valuable components such as teach-backs, group discussion, critical peer evaluation, and extended Q&A to ensure understanding and course effectiveness.



Travel Costs

By working with local law enforcement we are able to hold trainings in locations that are central to multiple agencies.

Budget Constraints

De-escalation training fees are typically in the \$1000s, so working with the DTC allows agencies to save a significant amount.

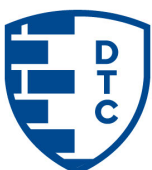
Staffing Shortages

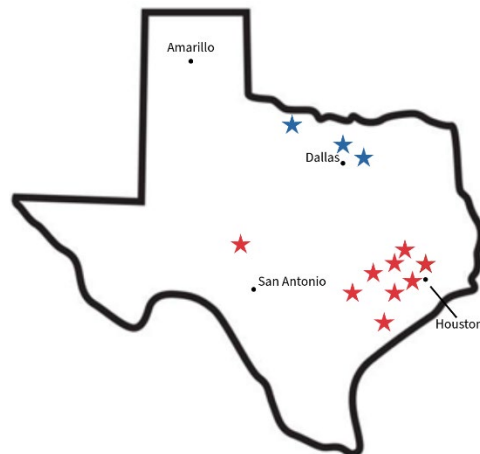

Additional Center Activities

DTC staff have played key roles in multiple additional grant applications, designed to bolster funding for future center activities. Of particular note, an application for a grant from the Bureau of Justice Administration at the Department of Justice to develop virtual reality training for law enforcement was submitted in partnership with Texas A&M and Sam Houston State University. In this grant application, the DTC would fulfill the role of training partner to assist in the development of training scenarios, as well as execution of training to law enforcement agencies. If this or other grants are awarded to the DTC, it will help ensure the long-term sustainability of the center's activities.

DTC staff were invited to participated in a Research Fair, hosted at SHSU by the Office of Research and Special Projects (ORSP) in September of 2023. Staff presented the DTC's program, to date training data, and current research in the field of de-escalation training for law enforcement, engaging with numerous interested individuals and sharing the mission and vision of the DTC.

Looking Forward

To date, the DTC has 6 scheduled trainings in 2024, as well as over a dozen additional strong leads with law enforcement agencies in the region, discussing potential de-escalation trainings. Due to cost saving measures, Director Garreth Tiefenbach projects that the center will exceed the number of required trainings performed for the project by at least 10%. Additionally, it is expected that the center will submit an extension request for the grant to the COPS Office, ensuring that the center will have ample time to complete as many trainings as possible.
